Public Guardian and Trustee of BC: The Public Guardian and Trustee of British Columbia operates under provincial law to protect the legal rights and financial interests of children, *to provide assistance to adults who need support for financial and personal decision making,* and to administer the estates of deceased and missing persons where there is no one else able to do so.

Designated Agencies for the Interior Health AuthorityServices Area: The

Public Guardian and Trustee, by regulation, has designated regional health authorities and Community Living BC to work together to look into reports they receive about abuse or neglect. In very serious circumstances, and in keeping with the principles of the legislation, designated agencies can gain access to adults, and can obtain court orders to provide various supports and assistance to adults.
